Supplemental Educational Services
2008-2009

- Under the Federal “No Child Left Behind” Act, Swanton School receives funding from Title I of the Act to support striving learners who are not meeting expected academic standards.
- Beginning in 2008-2009, a portion of this Title I money was dedicated, by law, to providing “supplemental educational services.”

What are “Supplemental Educational Services”?

- Supplemental Educational Services (SES) involves after school tutoring in academic areas by highly qualified teachers.
- Those wishing to provide SES services must apply through the Vermont Department of Education and be an “approved provider.”
- A list of “approved providers” is included with this link.
- In 2008-2009, Swanton contracted with the Stern Center. The Stern Center hired a number of Swanton teachers, who provided the after school tutoring.

SES Outcomes 2008-2009

- Any student who qualified for free or reduced priced lunch was eligible to receive tutoring.
- In 2008-2009, 253 students were eligible. Of these, a total of 31 students received the tutoring (12.2%)
- Of the 31 students, 16 dropped the tutoring or were discontinued because of attendance.
